### The following criteria are recommended for monitoring the student's performance in the course:

## a) To get a grade of 5 (excellent), a student's knowledge level must meet the following criteria:

- Fully explain the essence and content of the subject;
- ➤ Maintain scientific accuracy and logical consistency while avoiding errors and confusion;
- ➤ Have a clear understanding of the theoretical or practical significance of the subject materials;
- ➤ Demonstrate independent and critical thinking within the subject area;
- ➤ Provide precise and concise answers to given questions;
- ➤ Be well-prepared with thorough notes;
- ➤ Complete independent assignments fully and accurately;
- Master the relevant laws and regulatory documents related to the subject;
- ➤ Solve practical examples and problems related to the subject topics;
- ➤ Analyze and interpret problem situations;
- Complete a project related to the given topic.

# b) A student must meet the following requirements to get a Grade 4 (Good):

- ➤ Understand the essence and content of the subject while avoiding scientific and logical inconsistencies;
- ➤ Comprehend the practical significance of the subject;
- Complete assigned tasks and exercises within the curriculum framework;
- > Provide correct answers to subject-related questions;
- > Develop well-structured and thorough lecture notes;
- > Fully complete independent assignments related to the subject;
- > Solve practical examples and problems related to the subject topics;
- ➤ Analyze and interpret problem situations;
- ➤ Complete a project on the given topic.

# v) A student must meet the following requirements to get a Grade 3 (Satisfactory):

- ➤ Have a general understanding of the subject;
- > Present topics in a narrow scope with some inconsistencies;
- Lack of fluency in explanations;
- Provide vague and unclear answers to subject-related questions;
- > Fail to thoroughly solve practical examples and problems related to the subject.

### g) A student's performance is considered unsatisfactory (Grade 2) in the following cases:

- ➤ No preparation for the subject lessons;
- ➤ Lack of any understanding of the subject matter;
- Copied practical examples and problems from others;
- ➤ Made serious mistakes and inconsistencies in problem-solving;
- ➤ Unable to answer subject-related questions;

Lack of knowledge about the subject.

The midterm assessment and the evaluation of a student's knowledge for this type of assessment are carried out by the professor who conducted the relevant course sessions.

The final assessment and the evaluation of a student's knowledge for this type of assessment are carried out by a professor who did not conduct the course sessions. The professor who conducted the course sessions does not participate in the final assessment.

The professor or lecturer who conducted the respective course does not participate in administering the final assessment.

A student must complete the midterm assessment before the date of the final assessment for the relevant course.

A student who has missed 25% or more of the allocated classroom hours for a course without a tangible reason, or who did not take the midterm assessment, or who received an "unsatisfactory" grade (2) for this assessment, is disqualified from the course and not admitted to the final assessment. Consequently, the student is considered not to have earned the corresponding credits for the course.

A student who is not admitted to the final assessment fails to attend it, or receives an unsatisfactory grade for the final assessment is considered academically indebted.

Academically indebted students have the right to retake the failed courses during the holiday period or in subsequent semesters at their own expense. This is allowed after paying the required fee, which is calculated based on the amount of unearned credits and the base tuition fee.
