



Indicators of educational, moral-spiritual work, and meaningful organization of students' free time



Results during 2020–2024



Results achieved in international, national, and university-level competitions, contests, and tournaments



In the 2020-2021 academic year, students of TSUOS have achieved 100 results. 4 of them are at the international, 6 at the republican, 90 at the university level.

In the 2021-2022 academic year, students of TSUOS have achieved 112 results. 6 of them are at the international, 9 at the republican, 97 at the university level.

In the 2020-2021 academic year, students of TSUOS have achieved 129 results. 7 of them are at the international, 11 at the republican, 111 at the university level.

In the 2020-2021 academic year, students of TSUOS have achieved 136 results. 8 of them are at the international, 14 at the republican, 114 at the university level.




The chart shows the number of events organized by the psychologist of TSUOS for the university's staff and students in 2024.





Under the leadership of TSUOS psychologist B. Kalonova, the Young Psychologists Club was established at the university. Its purpose is to help students develop practical skills aimed at maintaining their mental and emotional stability during extracurricular time and studying the moral and psychological environment within the university.

The psychologist regularly conducts training sessions, Q&A meetings, and tests among students and staff. In addition, the psychologist visits student dormitories to check on their well-being and provide support when needed.

REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT IN THE FIELD OF EDUCATION IN 2024

Structure

A new organizational structure was developed at TSUOS. The number of faculties was optimized from 7 to 4, and the number of departments was reduced from 27 to 17.

The duration of internship practice ${\bf Internships} \quad {\rm has \ been \ increased \ from \ 12 \ weeks}$ to 18 weeks. TSUOS signed with 18 organizations to organize student internships and support graduate employment.

Majors

Starting from the 2024/2025academic year, 15 educational fields and 19 specialties have been launched.







Report for scientific affairs and innovations

Activities carried out in the field of training highly qualified scientific and academicpedagogical personnel



01 Doctoral Admissions

In 2024, the university admitted 42 doctoral students.

For 2025, 42 basic doctoral students and 1 research trainee were admitted.



02 Researcher Degree Awards

In 2024, a total of 39 researchers defended their dissertations. By the decision of the Higher Attestation Commission (HAC) Presidium, 30 researchers (7 DSc and 23 PhD) received their diplomas, while 9 researchers are still awaiting their diplomas.



03 New Program Admissions

Starting from 2025, admissions have been opened in the specialties of Language Theory, Applied and Computational Linguistics, and Theory and Methodology of Education and Upbringing.

Projects under State Scientific and Technical Programs:

10 research projects prepared at the university were submitted to the competition announced by the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation, aiming to foster innovation, address national priorities, and contribute to sustainable development.

Factors and Prospects of Sustainable **Development of** Connectivity between Central and South Asia

As part of the competition for applied projects conducted on the basis of the state order for scientific research by the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation of the Republic of Uzbekistan, a project developed by Doctor of Political Sciences, Professor Sayfiddin Juraev, was implemented. As a result of the grant, an 11volume series of monographs was published.

Using Local Attributes to Enhance the Ethno-Tourism Potential of Rishton, Chust, Yangikurgon, and **Boysun Districts**

In order to ensure the implementation of the tasks on enhancing tourism potential set out in paragraph 4 of the Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. 135 dated April 26, 2023, this project was carried out by TSUOS.





Highlight 1

In order to preserve greenery on the university campus, continuous agro-technical maintenance was carried out on 6,000 m² of green lawns, and 3,000 seasonal flowers were planted.

Highlight 2

In September, a total of 678 trees that had been planted on the university campus for more than three years were registered on the electronic platform "Yashil Makon".

Highlight 3

In October, seasonal shaping works were carried out on 144 junipers and 144 pines in the university garden area.







In 2024, a new 400-bed student dormitory was built through a public-private partnership at 33 Ziyolilar Street, Mirzo Ulugʻbek District, in line with the Cabinet of Ministers' Resolution No. 563 (09.09.2021), and put into operation to provide better accommodation for students.
