

INFORMATION ON THE WORK CARRIED OUT TO IMPROVE THE SYSTEM OF WORK WITH YOUTH, ENHANCE EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES AND DEVELOP THE SPIRITUAL AND EDUCATIONAL SPHERE

At Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies, the following activities have been organized to create a new and positive image of the education and upbringing system, as well as to improve work with youth and enhance activities in the spiritual and educational sphere:

A total of 277 full-time professors and teachers and 21 tutors have been involved in the educational and upbringing process. The work is carried out under the supervision of the First Vice-Rector for Youth Affairs and Spiritual and Educational Work, in cooperation with the Department for Work with Youth, Spirituality and Enlightenment, relevant deputy directors of institutes and deputy deans of faculties, tutors, a psychologist, the person responsible for women's affairs, a prevention inspector, the primary organization of the Youth Union, and professors and teachers.

A social and pedagogical-psychological service group consisting of specialists has been established to study the socio-psychological condition of students. The activities of the group are coordinated with the structure responsible for women's affairs and the work of the university psychologist.

To ensure prompt reception of appeals from students and their parents, the information system **“Appeal to the Tutor”** (@tsuos_tyutormurojaat_bot) was launched on December 6, 2025. This channel enables issues to be addressed directly to the responsible tutor and allows for a prompt response.

In accordance with the tradition established at TSUOS, throughout the 2025–2026 academic year, a healthy spiritual and educational environment was developed based on the following 7 important pillars:

- Sincere communication and tolerance;
- Honesty and fairness as guiding principles;
- Connection with one's roots, patriotism and a sense of belonging;
- Harmony of spirituality and knowledge;
- Targeted work with youth;
- Student initiative and a space for free communication;
- Teacher–student traditions and stability of the internal environment.

In order to educate students studying at Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies in the spirit of patriotism, increase their sense of involvement in the reforms being implemented in our country, and provide them with prompt and regular information about current developments, **“Enlightenment Lessons”** have been organized at the university starting from the 2025/2026 academic year.

Based on Order No. 28-XDFU of the Ministry dated February 25, 2025, **“Enlightenment Lessons”**, organized under the heading **“Hour of the Future”**, are conducted according to the approved schedule, with full coverage of all students. The lessons are conducted at a high quality level by heads and qualified professors and teachers based on materials obtained from the <https://milliytarbiya.uz/> platform.

The university has organized the **“Ma’rifat ulashib”** (**“Sharing Enlightenment”**) project, aimed at engaging students in reading books, increasing their level of literary literacy, and educating them in the spirit of patriotism and a sense of responsibility for the future of our country. Within the framework of the **“Ma’rifat ulashib”** project, visits are organized by prominent creative figures who are members of the Writers’ Union of Uzbekistan, as well as well-known writers, to Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies, general education schools, and mahallas located within their respective areas.

The university operates 5 creative clubs: the literary and creative club **“Mangu bitik”**, the **“Sharq yulduzi”** theatre studio, the **“Sanduvoch”** singing and dance ensemble, the

“Dutorchilar” ensemble, the “Sharq navolari” choir, the “Zakovat” club, as well as the “Sharqshunos” sports club in mini-football, volleyball and table tennis.

According to the assignment of the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation, within the framework of the “Kasbim – mening faxrim” (“My Profession – My Pride”) project, the “Computer Literacy” club began operating at the university's student dormitory from the 2025–2026 academic year.

At our university, the “Sewing Club” has been established starting from the current academic year with the aim of developing students’ creative abilities and enhancing their practical skills. Through the club, female students will have the opportunity to learn the basics of sewing, how to operate a sewing machine, how to make modern and traditional national garments, as well as the techniques of taking measurements, creating patterns, and clothing design.

– “Sharq yulduzi” Theatre Studio

At the beginning of 2025, the theatre studio was restructured and active and creative students were selected. A total of 30 students were involved in the club. Classes were held twice a week according to the established schedule.

Throughout the year, regular practical training was organized in stage speech, acting skills, movement and plasticity, and techniques for entering into roles.

During the 2025–2026 academic year, the “Sharq yulduzi” theatre studio prepared the following stage performances and plays:

- “Navoi and Bayqaro”;
- “Mother”;
- “Be Aware, People”, a play written by Usmon Azim;
- a social stage performance on the topic “Combating Drug Addiction”;
- “Babur”, a play based on the work “Starry Nights”;
- “The Crowd”, a play written by Nasrullo Qobil;
- “Mirzo Ulugbek”, a play based on the novel by Maqsud Shayxzoda;
- a play staged based on Nazar Eshonqul's work “People of War.”

– “Sanduvoch” Singing and Dance Club

The “Sanduvoch” singing and dance club is a creative group that brings together talented university students interested in art. The club has more than 30 active members, including solo performers, ensemble members and participants of the dance group.

Classes were held twice a week according to the established plan. Particular attention was paid to studying examples of national and world art, as well as improving practical skills in stage culture, vocal performance and choreography.

WORK CARRIED OUT DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR

The members of the club actively participated in university-wide events, including:

- Independence Day celebrations;
- the national holiday of Navruz;
- the “Dedication to Student Life” ceremony;
- spiritual and educational evenings on the topic “New Uzbekistan – New Development”;
- literary and artistic evenings dedicated to the anniversaries of our great ancestors.

During the events, national songs, folklore performances and modern stage productions were presented.

– “Dutorchilar” Club

The “Dutorchilar” club has been operating at Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies since 2021.

The club was established to teach students the art of playing the dutar, perform national melodies and songs, and improve their creative and musical skills. All students interested in music and musical instruments, as well as international students, have been involved in the club.

During the 2025–2026 academic year, members of the club actively participated in spiritual and educational events, celebrations, creative evenings and cultural and educational meetings held at the university, thereby widely promoting the art of playing national musical instruments. In

particular, performances by club members were organized during the national holiday of Navruz, Independence Day celebrations, Spirituality Weeks, as well as creative meetings with the participation of prominent artists and mentors.

– **“Mangu bitik” Literary and Creative Club**

The **“Mangu bitik”** literary and creative club operating under Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies carried out systematic activities throughout the 2025–2026 academic year aimed at enhancing the artistic and aesthetic thinking of students, promoting national and universal human values, supporting creative students and realizing their talents.

Along with poetry, the **“Mangu bitik”** literary and creative club began providing students with instruction in prose and journalism. At each club session, in addition to providing students with theoretical knowledge, writers and poets are invited in a practical format and meetings are organized with them.

At the beginning of 2026, the membership of the club was expanded, and 45 active and creative students were involved. Throughout the year, regular creative sessions were held once a week (a total of 38 meetings were conducted).

The priority areas of the club's activities are as follows:

- identifying talented young people among students who are interested in classical and contemporary poetry, prose, drama, journalism, literary translation and literary criticism;
- organizing creative seminars, master classes, poetry gatherings, book presentations, reading evenings and literary meetings; providing methodological assistance in editing, preparing for publication and promoting students' creative works;
- establishing cooperation with well-known writers and poets, translators, editors, literary scholars and publishing houses;
- developing a culture of reading and analyzing rare works of Uzbek and world literature;
- ensuring the active participation of club members in the spiritual and educational life of the university.

Since 2026, within the framework of the **“Shoir-u she'r-u shuur...”** project, well-known poets have been invited and poetry and music evenings have been held at the University Palace of Culture. According to the project, such events are held four times a year.

Among students, sports competitions were held in football, volleyball, basketball, chess, athletics and table tennis, including the **“Rector’s Cup,” “Student League,” “Universiade,” “Talaba-yugur,” “Sports Festival of Oriental Studies Students–2026,” “Five Initiatives Olympiad,” “Olympiad of Students of New Uzbekistan,”** as well as sports competitions among young teachers and students under the slogan **“Sport is the Guarantee of Health”** and the military-sports competition **“Heirs of Amir Temur.”** An interfaculty sports competition was also held in the student dormitory with the participation of teachers and students.

Sports facilities, sports grounds and indoor sports halls used for educational training and sports competitions have been provided with the necessary equipment. A Workout sports area for students and teaching staff has been launched in the university's main building.

The university stage of the republican competition **“The Most Active Student of the Year – 2025”** was held, and winners and prize-winners in 7 categories were identified.

At Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies, 6 students became recipients of the **“Special Scholarship named after Ogahiy,”** established to support talented, active and knowledgeable students who strive for science and enlightenment.

At Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies, 3 students became recipients of the university's **“Best Reader” Special Scholarship.**

At faculties and institutes, conditions were created for volunteer students to organize **“Oltin qo‘l”** charity events, and the funds raised from the sale of baked goods were delivered to a children's home. The **“Kitobxon talaba” (“Student Reader”)** competition and other reading-related activities continue to expand year by year. In particular, the **“Yosh kitobxon” (“Young Reader”)** competition, the **“Mening O‘zbekistonim” (“My Uzbekistan”)** video competition, the

“Quest step by step” project, and the “Yurtim qadriyatlari” (“Values of My Homeland”) competition were organized.

The Center for Increasing the Social Activity of Students and Pupils under the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation organized the republican “**Connoisseur of Reforms**” competition among teaching staff and students of educational institutions. At the **final stage** of the republican “**Connoisseur of Reforms**” competition, the Higher School of South Asian Languages and Literature of the Institute of Languages and Literature of the Peoples of the East at TSUOS took an honorable 3rd place in the nomination “**Best Department for Spiritual and Educational Work.**”

A competition titled “**O‘zbek tili – qalbim tarjimoni**” (“**The Uzbek Language – Translator of My Heart**”) was held among international students studying at the university whose native language is not Uzbek.

At the 2nd regional qualifying stage of the “**Student Theatre Studios**” competition-festival held among students of higher education institutions, the university team participated successfully and won an honorable 1st place.

The Center for Increasing the Social Activity of Students and Pupils under the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation held the “**Ma’rifat maydoni**” (“**Enlightenment Field**”) competition with the aim of increasing the enlightenment, knowledge and intellectual capacity of young people.

At the final stage of the first 2026 season of the online “**Kitobxon yoshlar ligasi**” (“**Young Readers League**”) competition organized by the Center for Increasing the Social Activity of Students and Pupils, TSUOS student Nigora Yaqubova took an honorable 3rd place among 145 participants.

The institute stage of the republican “**Best Creative Idea**” competition was held.

Various intellectual games were organized among students, including “**Zakovat,**” “**DEBATE,**” “**Munozara,**” “**Historical Zakovat,**” and the intellectual game “**Ittifoq Quiz.**”

Within the framework of the “**VII Festival of Oriental Studies Students,**” the “**Sharqshunos kitobxon**” project, a **football** competition for the “**Rector’s Cup,**” the “**Zakovat QUIZ**” intellectual game, and the “**National Values**” competition were held.

Under the slogan “**Travel Across the Homeland,**” cultural excursions for professors, teachers and students were organized with the aim of studying and widely promoting the ancient and rich history of our country, and strengthening among young people a sense of national pride and dignity. The excursions were organized under the themes “**The Memory of Our Ancestors Lives in Our Hearts**” (Alley of Writers, sacred sites), “**Uzbekistan – a Blessed Land,**” “**Why We Love Uzbekistan,**” and “**On the Path of Creation.**”

In cooperation between Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies and the Alisher Navoi International Public Foundation, the “**Navoiy izdoshlari**” (“**Followers of Navoi**”) competition, organized to commemorate the 585th anniversary of the birth of the great thinker Alisher Navoi, was held at a high level. Students who won the competition were duly awarded on February 9 of the current year at the V International Symposium on “**Alisher Navoi and the Eastern Renaissance,**” held at the university to commemorate the 585th anniversary of the birth of Mir Alisher Navoi.

An evening of poetry and music entitled “**Shoir-u she’r-u shuur...**” was organized at Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies. This spiritual and educational event was held jointly with the Writers’ Union of Uzbekistan and the **Madaniyat va ma’rifat** channel.

Within the framework of “**Youth Day,**” meetings entitled “**Dialogue between the Rector and Youth**” were held at the university every Thursday.

For female students of the university, training sessions on “**Secrets of the Profession**” were organized. In cooperation with the psychologist and the women's organization, discussions were held under the theme “**Conversations to Be Told in Confidence.**” Sewing, cooking and embroidery courses were organized in the student dormitory. In cooperation with the university

psychologist and the women's committee, the Telegram channel “**Ruhiyat ozig‘i**” was launched to address the psychological problems of young people and female students.

In accordance with the annual work plan, an electronic database of the socio-psychological profiles of each student was formed jointly with group tutors.

In cooperation with the university psychologist and tutors, the “**Young Psychologists**” club was established among students interested in psychology. The annual work plan of the club was developed by the psychologist and approved by the First Vice-Rector.

The university psychologist regularly organizes psychological seminars and training sessions for students and young people, which are conducted by faculty and group. Tutors assigned to groups and educator-teachers in student dormitories, together with the psychologist, conduct appropriate work and regular awareness-raising sessions with students identified as being prone to offenses, difficult to educate, or having low academic performance. They are also given warnings to prevent such situations from recurring. Psychological services play an important role in ensuring the comprehensive development of students studying at the university as mature individuals. In particular, a psychological support system has been established at universities to work with students who are prone to crime and offenses, difficult to educate or have low academic performance, to socially adapt them and prevent offenses in the future.

A wide range of preventive measures is being carried out to prevent offenses. In particular, in cooperation with the university psychologist and tutors, numerous preventive events, round-table discussions and individual preventive conversations are regularly held on preventing the use of narcotic and psychotropic substances, preventing crimes among students, resolving internal conflicts arising between students, and combating violence.

During the 2025–2026 academic year, the senior prevention inspector conducted more than 30 “**General Preventive Activities**” among students in the form of mentoring hours, round-table discussions, open lessons, seminars, meetings and assemblies on the topics “**Combating Crime and Offenses**,” “**We Are Against Pressure and Violence**,” “**Combating Narcotic and Psychotropic Substances**,” “**Combating Religious Extremism and Terrorism**,” “**We Will Combat Human Trafficking**,” “**Combating Ignorance through Enlightenment!**,” “**The Priority of Human Dignity and Rights – the Foundation of Development**,” “**Cybercrime – What Is It?**,” “**Drug Addiction – the Ruin of Life**,” covering more than 1,000 students.

A public group called “**Qalqon**” has been established at Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies. Currently, the group consists of 20 members, including 18 male students and 2 female students. Members of the “**Qalqon**” public group are fully provided with uniforms bearing special distinguishing marks, membership certificates, and radio communication equipment for operational communication. The “**Qalqon**” public group operates during the second half of the day to ensure public safety at the university and to prevent crimes and offenses at an early stage. Since the beginning of the academic year, members of the “**Qalqon**” public group have organized preventive activities and individual conversations. As a result of this work, 2 cases of crime and offenses were prevented at an early stage on the university premises. In addition, a Telegram group called “**QALQON**” was established for continuous monitoring of the group's activities and prompt information exchange.

During the 2025–2026 academic year, Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies systematically organized visits to a number of museums and theatre institutions for employees and students in order to enhance their spiritual and educational level and strengthen respect for national heritage and culture.

In particular, visits for students were organized to the following museums:

Abdulla Qahhor House Museum, Islam Karimov Museum, Yunus Rajabiy House of Creativity, State Museum of the History of the Timurids, Amir Temur Museum and Amir Temur Square, Museum of the History of Communications, Abdulla Qodiriy House Museum, Museum of Glory, State Museum of Arts of Uzbekistan, Yunus Rajabiy House Museum and others.

During these visits, students were provided with detailed information about the rich historical and cultural heritage of our ancestors, the life and work of representatives of national literature and art, as well as the stages of development during the period of independence.

In addition, students visited the **Ilkhom Theatre**, where particular attention was paid to developing artistic thinking, aesthetic taste and social activity through stage performances.

At Tashkent State University of Oriental Studies, spiritual and educational events are systematically organized and widely celebrated in connection with holidays and commemorative dates that hold an important place in the life of the state and society. Within the framework of these events, seminars, round-table discussions, open dialogues and educational meetings are held, with particular attention paid to strengthening students' historical memory, national values and patriotic feelings.

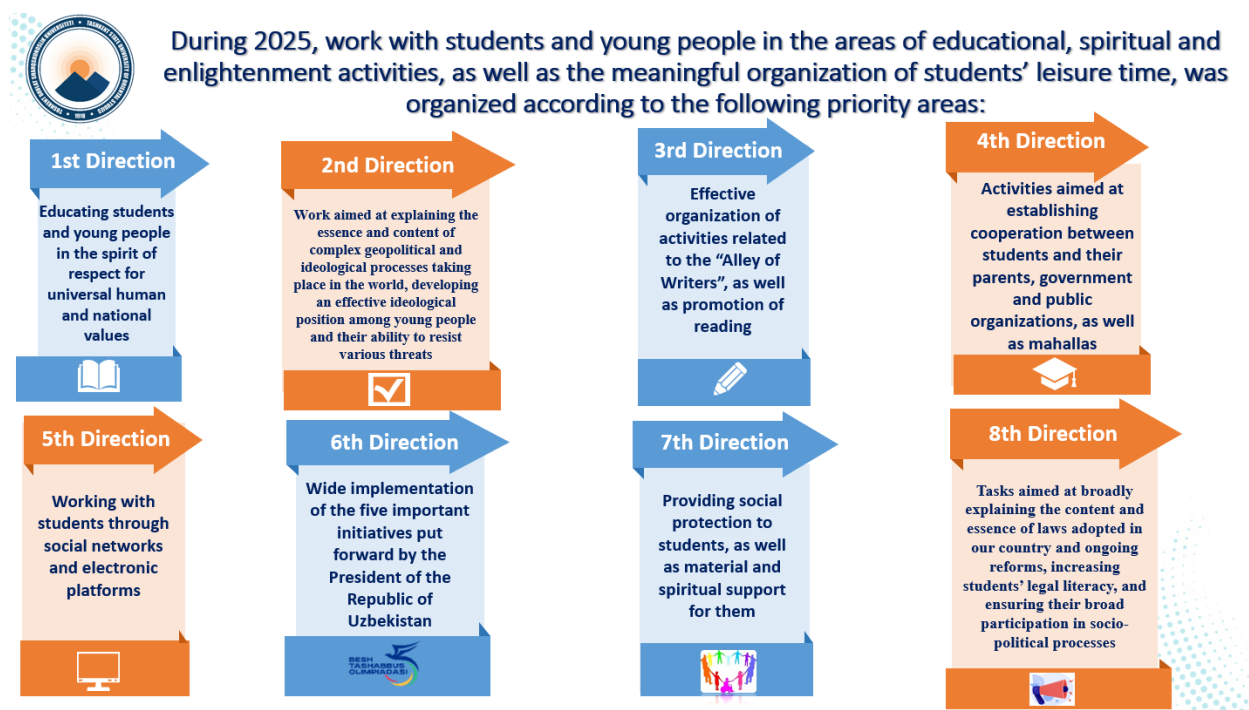
In particular, a series of spiritual and educational events are organized at the university at a high level in connection with January 14 – the Day of the Armed Forces of the Republic of Uzbekistan and Defenders of the Motherland Day; March 8 – International Women's Day; March 21 – the national holiday of Navruz; May 9 – the Day of Remembrance and Honor; September 1 – Independence Day; and December 8 – Constitution Day of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

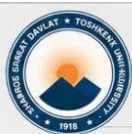
In addition, scientific and literary evenings, round-table discussions and open dialogues are regularly held in connection with important historical dates: February 9, the birthday of the great thinker Alisher Navoi; February 14, the birthday of statesman and poet Zahiriddin Muhammad Babur; and March 1, the birthday of People's Poet of Uzbekistan Zulfiya.

In accordance with the university's brand, the main goal of reforms in the field of education and upbringing is to train highly qualified specialists with high intellectual potential, who have mastered modern information technologies, are capable of working on the basis of professional skills, qualifications and independent thinking, and meet international standards.

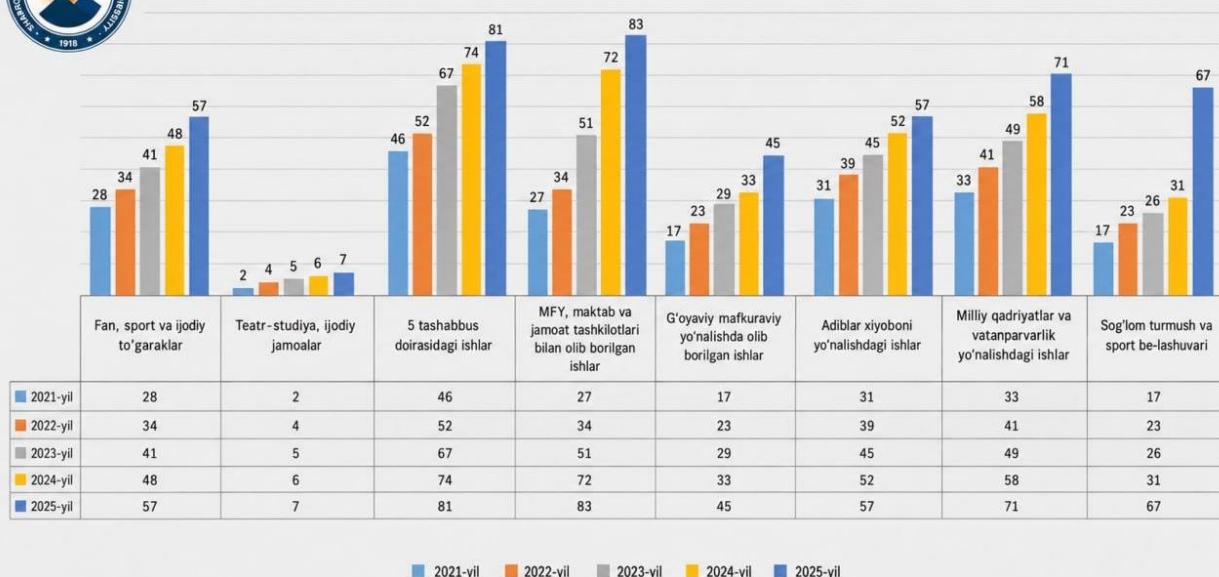
