These Qualification Requirements have been developed in accordance with the “State Educational Standard of Higher Education. Basic Provisions”, the “State Educational Standard of Higher Education. Classifier of Higher Education Fields and Specialties”, the National and Sectoral Qualification Frameworks of the Republic of Uzbekistan, professional standards, and proposals of personnel customers, and constitute an official regulatory and methodological document.

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1. General description

Training of bachelors in the educational programme **60310200 – International Relations** is carried out in full-time and part-time forms of study. The normative duration of the bachelor's programme in the full-time form is **4 years**.

1.1. Scope of application

1.1.1. Application of the Qualification Requirements

The Qualification Requirements set out the set of requirements for all higher education institutions that train bachelors in the educational programme **60310200 – International Relations**.

1.1.2. Main users of the Qualification Requirements

The Qualification Requirements for this educational programme are intended for:

- managerial staff of a higher education institution (rector, vice-rectors, head of the academic and methodological department, deans and heads of departments) and academic staff who are responsible for developing and updating the curriculum and course syllabi in this field, for the effective organisation of the educational process on that basis, and who, within their authority, are accountable for the level of graduate preparedness;
- students of the higher education institution who follow the curriculum and course syllabi of the educational programme;
- State Attestation Commissions that assess the level of preparedness of bachelor's graduates;
- authorised state bodies for education administration;
- bodies that finance higher education institutions;
- authorised state bodies that accredit higher education institutions and supervise quality;
- personnel customers and employer organisations and enterprises;
- applicants seeking admission to higher education institutions, their parents and other interested persons.

1.2. Description of professional activities

1.2.1. Areas of professional activity

The area of professional activity covers the set of means, methods and techniques of human activity aimed at developing the field of international relations, determining the prospects of foreign policy, and building professional skills and executive capacity, as well as theoretical and practical work directly related to the system of political knowledge — the history and theory of international relations, the fundamentals of diplomacy, the international relations of Uzbekistan and foreign states, international organisations, political parties, public administration bodies and other actors of international relations.

1.2.2. Objects of professional activity

Research institutions and organisations in the social sciences and humanities; international departments and divisions of ministries, state committees, political parties, khokimiyats (local executive authorities) and other state bodies and institutions; work as an international-relations specialist / political scientist in non-state and state systems connected with national and international activity.

Graduates of the bachelor's educational programme **60310200 – International Relations** are entitled to address a comprehensive range of issues relating to international relations and foreign-policy activity in: the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Diplomatic Service, the World Information Agency and Diplomatic Courses; diplomatic missions and consular posts of the Republic of Uzbekistan in foreign states; diplomatic missions and consular posts of foreign states in the Republic of Uzbekistan; and the international departments and divisions of ministries, state committees, political parties, khokimiyats and other state bodies and institutions.

1.2.3. Types of professional activity

The types of professional activity include:

- research;
- spiritual and educational;
- organisational and managerial;
- project management;
- expert-analytical;
- consulting services;
- translation, and similar activities.

1.2.4. Professional tasks

In accordance with Level 6 of the National Qualifications Framework and with the areas, objects and types of professional activity of the bachelor, a graduate of the educational programme **60310200 – International Relations** shall be capable of performing the following professional tasks.

In research activity:

- carrying out various studies in the political sciences, conducting related practical work, applying research results in practice, and participating in the development of procedures for expert review of literature on world politics;
- studying specialised literature and other scholarly collections in political science, as well as domestic and foreign research achievements;
- preparing research developments and participating in the expert review of literature in political science;
- collecting and processing data and conducting systematic analysis of scholarly information on a given topic;
- participating in the application of research results and developments;
- using modern information technologies, computer equipment and communication tools in practical activity.

In spiritual and educational activity:

- being able to plan spiritual and educational work, mastering methods of organising it, and instilling the idea of national independence in the minds of learners;
- knowing methods and technologies for developing in learners immunity against ideological and information attacks;
- conducting explanatory work on the role and influence of the written spiritual heritage in processes taking place under conditions of globalisation;
- holding individual conversations in mahallas on issues of spiritual and moral education;
- revealing, in the conduct of national customs and ceremonies, such high human qualities as universal values, compassion, tolerance, patriotism and loyalty.

In organisational and managerial activity:

- organising and managing various events, conferences and educational talks in the political sciences;
- developing mechanisms for monitoring processes related to the creation and use of information-technology systems in information-resource centres and for assessing their quality;
- participating in the supervision of production processes with regard to compliance with environmental protection and occupational safety requirements;
- developing, with the use of information technologies, mechanisms for monitoring production processes and assessing quality;
- organising and managing social and spiritual-educational work in a team;
- making sound decisions in conditions of differing opinions;

- drawing up a work plan for the activity being performed, monitoring it and evaluating the results of the work carried out.

In project-management activity:

- implementing a project-based approach in planning and executing various events and initiatives.

In expert-analytical activity:

- conducting analytical and research work on the basis of a systematic approach and using computer modelling and experimental methods.

In consulting activity:

- carrying out expert review of projects, sources, literature, and electronic video and audio products on topics corresponding to the field;
- providing consulting services in areas corresponding to the specialisation.

In translation activity:

- possessing the ability to provide translation from foreign languages in state organisations and in privately owned non-state organisations.

2. Requirements for professional competences

The professional competences of a bachelor in the educational programme **60310200 – International Relations** are defined by the professional tasks set out in subsection 1.2.4 and correspond to Level 6 of the National Qualifications Framework of the Republic of Uzbekistan. A graduate shall possess the knowledge, skills and abilities required for research, spiritual-educational, organisational-managerial, project-management, expert-analytical, consulting and translation work in international relations and foreign policy.

3. Requirements for internships (practical training)

The qualification internship is aimed at consolidating theoretical knowledge acquired in general professional and specialised courses, integrating it with practical (workplace) processes, and forming the relevant practical skills, competences and qualifications.

The following internships are conducted under the educational programme:

1. Introductory internship;
2. Qualification internship;
3. Pre-graduation internship.

REVIEW

The implementation of the Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan “On Education”, a fundamental reform of the content of education, and ensuring that the quality of trained personnel meets the requirements of the deep economic and social reforms being carried out in the republic, as well as the advanced world level of development of education, science, engineering and technology, depend directly on the content of the Qualification Requirements.

The Qualification Requirements and curriculum of the educational programme 60310200 – International Relations have been developed in accordance with the Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan “On Education”; Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. PQ-3775 of 5 June 2018 “On additional measures to improve the quality of education in higher education institutions and to ensure their active participation in the comprehensive reforms being implemented in the country”; Order No. 259 of 9 June 2023 of the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovations “On improving the process of developing regulatory and methodological documents of higher education”; Order No. 168 of 20 May 2024 of the Ministry “On introducing amendments and additions to the State Standard of the Republic of Uzbekistan O‘z DSt 3557:2021 ‘State Educational Standard of Higher Education. The updated Qualification Requirements and curriculum drawn up for the educational programme 60310200 – International Relations have been harmonised on the basis of foreign experience; particular attention has been paid to ensuring that learners develop deep knowledge, independent thinking and a high level of professional skill; the formation, in the process of mastering the courses, of experience, skills and understanding, knowledge of the requirements set and the ability to use them effectively are correctly indicated.

In the Qualification Requirements and the curriculum, broad scope is given to modern methods and technologies, seminar classes, independent learning and analysis of the information obtained in studying current problems facing science and technology and in seeking positive solutions to them.

In developing the Qualification Requirements, the principles of democratisation and humanisation of education, preservation of distinctiveness under conditions of globalisation, and integration into the global educational space have been observed. The composition of courses by blocks in the Qualification Requirements and their relative proportions have been reviewed from the standpoint of strengthening graduates’ ability to apply in practice the theoretical knowledge acquired in their chosen specialisation. The allocation of the time budget assigned to courses among theoretical, practical, experimental and independent work is aimed at consolidating the graduate’s theoretical knowledge and forming the skill of applying it successfully in practice.

In developing the Qualification Requirements and the curriculum, the demands and proposals of peer higher education institutions have been taken into account.

In conclusion, the updated Qualification Requirements and curriculum drawn up for the training of bachelors in the educational programme 60310200 – International Relations are aimed at bringing the higher-education process up to world standards, comprehensively cover issues relating to the training of well-rounded
