The right to officially publish these Qualification Requirements within the territory of the Republic of Uzbekistan belongs to the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

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## **1. General description.**

Training in the Master's degree program 70220502 – Eastern Philosophy and Culture is delivered on a full-time basis. The program is organized within the credit-module system, and its standard duration is two years.

### **1.1. Scope**

#### **1.1.1. Application of the Qualification Requirements.**

The Qualification Requirements establish a set of requirements for all higher education institutions that provide training under the Master's degree program 70220502 – Eastern Philosophy and Culture.

#### **1.1.2. Main users of the Qualification Requirements:**

The main users of these Qualification Requirements are:

- administrative staff of higher education institutions responsible for developing and updating qualification requirements, curricula and course syllabi for this Master's degree program, as well as organizing the educational process effectively and ensuring, within their authority, that graduates attain the required level of training (rector, vice-rectors, head of the academic department, deans and heads of departments), and academic staff;
- students of higher education institutions mastering the curriculum and course syllabi of the Master's degree program;
- State Attestation Commissions that assess the level of preparedness of Master's graduates;
- authorized state bodies responsible for education management;
- bodies providing financing for higher education institutions;
- authorized state bodies responsible for accreditation and quality control of the higher education system;
- personnel customers, employing organizations and enterprises;
- Bachelor's graduates intending to enter higher education institutions and other stakeholders.

## **1.2. Description of professional activities**

### **1.2.1. Areas of professional activity:**

The specialty 70220502 – Eastern Philosophy and Culture belongs to the field of “Humanities” and covers teaching specialty-related subjects and Eastern and Western languages in all educational institutions; conducting scientific research at the Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Uzbekistan and sectoral research institutes, centers and research-and-production associations; management activities in organizations of various forms of ownership, non-governmental and non-commercial organizations, central and local public administration bodies, small-business and private-entrepreneurship entities, and state and public organizations connected with foreign Eastern countries; solving complex professional problems in enterprises of various forms of ownership, as well as the totality of tools, methods and techniques of human activity aimed at professional competence and responsibility.

### **1.2.2. Objects of professional activity:**

- pedagogical activity in higher education, retraining and professional development institutions, general secondary, specialized secondary and vocational education institutions, including teaching specialty-related subjects and Eastern and Western languages;
- processes of conducting scientific and applied research and theoretical and practical analysis in the field of Eastern philosophy and culture at the Academy of Sciences and sectoral research institutes and centers, as well as higher education institutions;
- management processes in state and local public administration bodies;
- processes of organizing and managing translation and work activities in sectors of the economy, production and non-production complexes, associations, corporations, concerns, firms, companies, holdings and production associations of different forms of ownership.

**1.2.3. Types of professional activity:**

- research activity;
- pedagogical activity;
- spiritual and educational activity;
- organizational and managerial activity;
- consulting and service activities.

**1.2.4. Professional tasks:**

In accordance with Level 7 of the National Qualifications Framework and with the areas, objects and types of professional activity of a master in the Master's degree program 70220502 – Eastern Philosophy and Culture, a Master's graduate must be capable of performing the following professional tasks:

**In research activity:**

- conducting scientific and applied research, analyzing experimental results and drawing scientifically substantiated conclusions, and identifying scientific novelty;
- preparing and editing scientific articles, lectures, treatises and educational literature; preparing scientific reviews on the subject of research being conducted; compiling abstracts and bibliographies;
- purposefully searching for and identifying the latest scientific, design, technological and operational achievements in scientific literature and on the Internet;
- organizing and conducting scientific seminars, conferences and symposia and actively participating in them;
- preparing scientific articles in the field for scientific journals, and carrying out pedagogical and educational-methodological activities in the specialty at higher education, retraining and professional-development institutions;
- developing scientific projects on relevant topics and possessing skills for developing conceptual and theoretical models of scientific problems and tasks being addressed.

**In pedagogical activity:**

- conducting pedagogical and educational-methodological activities related to teaching specialty subjects and Eastern and Western languages in higher education, retraining and professional development, general secondary, specialized secondary and vocational education institutions;
- conducting classes using modern information and pedagogical technologies and non-traditional methods;
- preparing lecture texts and lesson plans;
- using new pedagogical and information technologies;
- organizing students' independent work and studying its educational-methodological support;
- applying modern and distance forms of education;
- carrying out educational and upbringing activities;
- continuously improving oneself through independent education and creative inquiry in the subject taught, in pedagogical activity, and in methods, tools and other related fields.

**In moral and educational activity:**

- planning spiritual and educational work, mastering methods of organizing it, and applying advanced ideas from the history of Eastern philosophy while instilling the idea of national independence in learners' consciousness;
- understanding the essence of spiritual and ideological threats in today's dangerous world and knowing methods and means of counteracting them;
- using methods and technologies for developing students' immunity to ideological and information attacks;
- conducting explanatory work on the importance of applying the spiritual heritage of Central Asian thinkers and the moral values reflected in it in combating spiritual threats arising under globalization;
- conducting individual discussions on spiritual and moral education in local communities (mahallas);

- promoting universal values and such high human qualities as kindness and compassion, tolerance, patriotism and loyalty in the organization of national traditions and ceremonies.

### **In organizational, managerial, consulting and service activities:**

- optimizing the organizational structure of an organization, enterprise and its individual divisions; organizing and managing the improvement of employees' professional preparedness; planning the efficient use of labor potential and introducing a labor incentive system;
- developing methodological guidelines, legal and regulatory documents for planning, accounting and analyzing the activities of an economic entity;
- participating in the development and substantiated selection of management-decision options based on socio-economic efficiency criteria, taking into account their risks and consequences;
- collecting documents required for concluding contracts, organizing operational and statistical accounting, and determining procedures for preparing reports;
- monitoring compliance with environmental protection, fire safety, technical safety and occupational safety requirements in production processes;
- analyzing family, gender and demographic policy, employment relations, socio-economic and demographic processes in the specialty and developing forecasts for these processes;
- organizing and carrying out translation work in Eastern and Western languages.

### **2. Requirements for professional competencies.**

- possess a system of knowledge related to the scientific worldview, the fundamentals of general methodological disciplines, and the ability to independently analyze economic problems and processes;
- understand the content of professional documents and work in one of the studied Eastern or Western languages, know the methodology of scientific research and pedagogy, and be able to apply it in professional activity on the basis of modern scientific methods;

- be able to independently acquire new knowledge, work on self-development and organize labor activity on a scientific basis;
- creatively and critically review and analyze acquired knowledge and use it in scientific activity;
- be able to use regulatory and legal documents in one's activity and make substantiated independent decisions in professional activity;
- possess the principal methods and tools for obtaining, storing and processing information from the Internet, and have skills in working with a computer as a means of information management;
- be able to use information technologies, understand the essence and significance of information technologies in an information society, recognize the risks and threats of information attacks, and comply with basic information-security requirements;
- possess skills for conducting scientific and applied research, processing experimental results and drawing scientifically substantiated conclusions, preparing and editing scientific articles, organizing and conducting scientific seminars, conferences and symposia, and developing scientific projects;
- know how to use information and pedagogical technologies in pedagogical activity;
- know innovative approaches to improving the quality and effectiveness of education;
- possess skills for preparing project proposals to participate in projects announced in the country and abroad on the basis of scientific-activity results;

- possess skills for organizing and managing work activities;
- know the methodology and foundations of scientific research in Eastern philosophy and culture, be able to describe the research process, formulate conclusions and evaluate results, distinguish empirical and theoretical research

methods, develop an extended research plan, and distinguish fundamental, applied and innovative projects from one another;

- know appropriate methods for searching, classifying and systematically analyzing materials necessary for researching theoretical problems of Eastern philosophy and culture;
- know the methods of searching for and working with scientific-theoretical literature and sources related to Eastern philosophy and culture;
- know the natural-scientific and socio-philosophical heritage of the peoples of Central Asia; the characteristics of the socio-philosophical thought of the peoples of the Near and Middle East (VIII–XVIII centuries); Eastern philosophy of the modern and contemporary periods; the problems and directions of modern Western philosophy; the problems of the development of national cultures under globalization; and be able to comparatively analyze anthropological problems in Eastern and Western philosophy.

### **3. Requirements for scientific activity.**

Scientific activity must provide for the mastery of scientific-research methodology and the performance by students of scientific-research and scientific-pedagogical work in specialized scientific and educational institutions.

*Requirements for research work and preparation of the Master's dissertation:*

- develop practical skills for independent research activity;
- conduct scientific research using modern information-technology tools, analyze and present research results, and develop knowledge and skills related to preparing scientific articles;
- be able to use databases containing the latest advances in science, engineering and technology in the field and develop the ability to use them in carrying out the Master's dissertation.

*Research and teaching work:*

- develop pedagogical skills and competencies through the use of modern pedagogical and information technologies and interactive methods of educational work;

- develop the ability and skills to organize educational processes on a scientific and methodological basis.

*Research internship (practical experience):*

In Master's training, the research internship is conducted in the 4th semester. It should ensure the conduct of scientific-research work in the field and the deepening of theoretical and practical knowledge; familiarization with modern equipment and technologies in science, the field and other sectors; development of relevant practical, professional and scientific-research competencies; and opportunities for effective adaptation to the profession. A Master's student assigned to a research internship is expected to carry out the educational process according to an individual schedule.
